

“Three months after Neil Diamond recorded ‘Sunflower’, Glen Campbell released his own version of this up-tempo gem in June 1977, as the second single from his chart-topping country album, ‘Southern Nights’. The song soared to No.1 on the easy listening charts and No. 4 on the country charts.

Though Diamond is unsure how the song made its way to Campbell, he’s fond of Campbell’s version and of the man. “I’ve always been a Glen Campbell fan. I did his show quite a few times when he had the weekly TV show The Glen Campbell Goodtime Hour.” Diamond recalls. His only concern about Campbell’s take? He didn’t consider the song complete. “Glen recorded the song before it was finished. The last verse just repeated from earlier in the song.” Diamond says. Here, he’s added some new lyrics. “I still like it. I like the groove,” Diamond says, “I’m glad we finally got it out.”
